
Enrolment!

Coding

Last Thursday I joined the year 5 and 6 students with Miss Yonetani and Ms Steans for their coding class. Some pictures follow in the gallery but I was struck by the collaboration between students and the benefits of solving problems together. There are many useful sites online to describe the benefits of coding aside from the gains in digital literacy these include: logico-deductive reasoning, expressing yourself in different ways, critical for many occupations now and in the future, diverse thinking skills and the opportunity to create and innovate not just to participate.



Curriculum

As part of our attention to writing this term, staff are working to implement the processes of Storytelling Schools into their writing program across the school. This is a program researched in the UK and has proven benefits for raising standards of writing and reading for students. With a strong oral language base, it allows all abilities to innovate and create using stories that are well known to students. A corollary of raised achievement is increased motivation in all forms of written expression. Talk with your teacher for more details but early work started in 2016 is encouraging. In very general terms, Writing (National Standards reporting area of the curriculum) often lags behind the other areas - Reading and Mathematics - in schools across NZ.

We are partnering with our neighbouring schools in Professional Learning in this area and the Resource Teachers in Literacy Service to develop responsive plans in our school to those at risk of not meeting standards at St Mark's School.

On Sunday I had the privilege of sharing some of my faith journey, preaching at the Transitional Cathedral. The topic was "Taking risks for God", and Dean Lawrence Kimberley has asked four people to share some of their story on this topic over the Lent period. Apart from the challenge of the height of the pulpit and the not so strategically placed glass of water, it was a joy to share our St Mark's School mission statement - "Transforming Lives Through the St Mark's Story - as part of this talk which invites everyone to be transformational in the lives of others. We could replace St Mark's with our own names and ask ourselves "What is God looking for in you and me, and how can He greatly use us?" This mission statement is at the heart of this school yet has a wider reach if we are prepared to take risks in His name.
