Venue: Hansen Park

No Postponement: We will advise if the cross country venue changes to being at School on Thursday via the SchoolApp if the weather is too wet and cold.

Race Distances / order:	Year 3	1 lap
	Year 4	1 lap
	Year 5 & 6	2 laps - 2km
	Year 7 & 8	3 laps - 3km

Transportation: Students will depart School after the roll and walk to Hansen Park. (Year 3 and 4 will walk down later)

Student Requirements:

- Come to school dressed in full PE gear (shorts, top, white sports socks, shoes)
- If a school tracksuit or sweatshirt is owned it should be worn, alternatively jerseys, thermals and blazers may be worn
- Students should be dressed in warm clothing as Hansen Park can be very cold and we will be there for 2 hours
- Wear suitable footwear (bare feet are not permitted)
- Bring a water bottle and snack that can be easily carried to Hansen Park
- Students will not be required to change into their school uniform when they return to school

Zone entry is for Years 5 -8 and is based on placings and times. Community attendance at this event is both welcome and encouraged.


