

Welcome to Worship

This Sunday we're very excited to invite the children and families of Waka Pūhara to join us for worship. Joint services between the parish and school have been a part of our shared life since the school's beginning and we greatly value the connection. They are an important part of the special character life of the school and attendance is expected.

What to Expect

- The service will last approximately 1 hour, with morning tea to follow.
- Grandparents, siblings and others are very warmly invited to join us.
- Students (incl. siblings in other waka) are expected to wear their dress uniform.
- A collection will be taken to assist the running of the parish.
- We will be celebrating Holy Communion in a semi-picnic style where bread and wine in a common cup will be offered. Students and adults are welcome to receive both, but receiving the bread only is perfectly acceptable. If receiving both we ask you not to dip the bread into the wine.
- Selected students will be reading and praying during the service.
- At the end of the service all students will lead a sung blessing.

We'll be reading about the feeding of the 5,000 from Matthew 14:13-21, and want to re-enact some of it so, if you're able, please

- Bring a picnic rug and some cushions or beach chairs to sit on.
- Come early to have time to set up your picnic area (perhaps sharing with a friendly family).
- Bring something for the City Mission food bank (we hope to have 12 baskets full).
