You simply sign up on the fundraising website, share the link with family and friends and they can arrange to collect their products from you at the end of the fundraiser.

How do I sign up to fundraise online?

What happens at the end of the fundraiser?

At the end of the fundraising campaign (last day for sales is 31st July) all orders will be compiled, and products will be collected and distributed in the School Hall on Friday 19th August 2.30 - 4pm. You will then collect all orders made from your fundraising page for you to distribute.

Before pickup day, each fundraiser will be sent a report (to their registered email) showing all the supporters who have purchased from their fundraising web page and what items/quantities they have purchased.
