CURRICULUM AREA

Sport 2018

Strength in sport has been a hallmark of excellence at St Mark's for many years. St Mark's sports teams have proudly represented the school in many disciplines as students of all ages have worn maroon and gold with pride.

In recent times there have been multiple challenges to continuing this proud history, however excellence has continued. Frequent reporting in our newsletters indicate that varied sports and P.E programs have continued to high levels. It has saddened me when I have heard of parent frustrations often voiced as a "lack of sport" - this is not reflected in our school programs and staff have shared the frustration of various restrictions.

Shifts in Junior Sport Canterbury wide post quake has shifted this landscape, with many schools not able to, or unwilling to field teams in formal competitions particularly Saturdays. Indeed some Canterbury codes have actively discouraged school teams from competing in formal competitions.

For these and other reasons there has been an ongoing conversation and review among staff as to the future of sport and physical education at St Mark's School. As this is a key area of the curriculum it is an operational matter, and one that needed much thought. The school was in a full building program until Term 3 last year - the opening of the hall and full playground, coupled with a burgeoning roll have provided the perfect conditions for acting on these conversations.

Today I can share that Students in Years 5-8 will have the opportunity to compete in the Canterbury Schools competitions on Friday afternoons during Terms 2 and 3. The sports represented here are hockey, netball, football and rugby.

Parents of younger students have previously organised teams outside of school hours e.g. junior netball, miniball, football and touch rugby. We will continue to support these moves by including senior students as coaches, space for practices and flexibility for game times etc.

In addition we are continuing to develop existing robust Fitness and Physical Education programs, which have naturally expanded as the school campus has opened up.

It has of course been wonderful to draw on the expertise of our community. For example **Mr George Carnoutsos** (an ex-Olympic Hockey player, former St Mark's student, and grandfather of a current student), working last year during Terms 2 and 3 spearheading our Junior Hockey program. This commitment was so special, I know there have been countless parents who have stepped in to coach, manage and support various teams, and I know of future offers of support. THANK YOU!!

Our connections to the Independent Schools Sports program will continue to grow - our wonderful **Mrs Maree Bigelow** has taken on the role of secretary of this organisation for 2018 and 2019.

We are also looking to strengthen our ties with other schools, with an eye on sports and cultural exchanges.

As we explore other areas of school life in this newsletter each week, can I invite you to talk with your teacher or myself about those things that raise questions for you.
