Kia ora everyone,

A short week for everyone and we trust the long weekend was a nice breather in the busyness of your weeks. As such this newsletter offers the chance to highlight "happenings" - some for your diary and some just as celebration of our programs in the school.

Programs of difference emerging (not an exhaustive list!)

It may be of interest to learn that we have the following programs in place, some of which are pilots:

- Extension literacy program in Waka Hourua
- Extension mathematics in Waka Puhara
- A pilot typing program for selected students
- Students who have their own devices at school as part of supported learning program/aid to learning.
- Senior Dance group that is student created and driven.
- Football program running each Monday afternoon in Waka Puhara
- Wordlab our "spelling program" which has a strong connection to phonics and reading development. The refinement of this program is ongoing.

Kia Kaha Program

Whilst this program is drawing to a close, the principles and outworking of our response and prevention programs are being refined. The program is a starting point in the conversations in our school that will eventually clarify our policies and processes in place for managing behaviour including bullying. Keeping in our sights that bullying is "deliberate, involves an imbalance in power, has an element of repetition and is harmful", we can better understand what our responses might be. Please keep these conversations going - there is much to be said about using the word "proactive" here.




