Uniform Shop







We are currently very fortunate to have a small team of dedicated volunteers who manage our shop. St Mark's School Uniform Shop was set up initially to sell second hand clothing. It has evolved into what it is today because Ballantynes stopped stocking our uniform. Fortunately space has always been found on site to try and offer the best service and convenience to parents as part of the special character of the school it is required that a formal uniform be worn.

The team have a heavy responsibility of minimum orders (sometimes as much as \$10,000), fixing supplier errors, maintaining adequate stock levels with the seasonal changes and introducing new lines as the uniform evolves. There has been some recent issues of socks and kilts not arriving as per ordered and this puts a lot of stress on the volunteers and the parents alike. Fiona is always looking at new suppliers but this can sometimes result in further delays and costs. The shop also does a sterling service of on selling second hand uniforms. This service helps to reduce costs to parents of rapidly growing children and is especially useful when the children reach Year 9. The shop currently makes a small profit which contributes to the books donated by the PA for our New Entrants at prize giving. We are very fortunate that the school has never had to find funds if we were to make a loss.

All of our volunteers also have families and paid employment to juggle as well. Fiona has run the shop for the past 8 years. The shop has just installed a new mobile Eftpos terminal which can also be used at the Fair and Coffee Cart and has just installed a new computer system to enable some future proofing.

The Uniform Shop is currently open on Tuesday 8.30-9.30am and Thursday 2.30-3.30pm.
