FIRST MARK OF MISSION! - 5 MOM Part 2!

This must be developmentally appropriate for our students but woven across all we do. To make it a natural part of our learning here sets us apart - it is part of our story and the fabric of the traditions laid down by those who came before us.



STORIES capturing attention

This morning in The Press there is a story about research in Canterbury indicating the alarming rates of PTSD in Canterbury children. It is so easy to look at this research in relation to your own child, and imagine that this research somehow overstates the issue. However as I have pointed to Dr Kathleen Liberty's research in previous newsletters, some of the baseline data, gathered prior to 2011 from study on children's respiratory conditions, provides a significant indication of the physiological, psychological and developmental consequences for children. The findings for parents, whanau and educators can be part of our conversations. If reading this article raises any concerns for you about you or your child, we are here to listen.

The other story related to National Standards, which are an inevitable political football in an election year. As a staff, we work within the compliance requirements of the Ministry of Education and report progress of every student to parents and the Ministry as part of this process. Whilst some may say they are a "blunt instrument" of achievement, being assessed and measured against some form of standard is a consequence for us all. Quantitative measures have to sit alongside qualitative ones - because what is changing for every student to make them successful might not be seen in numbers! - yet! Again you can talk with your child's teacher or any staff member teaching your child for information.
