Student Leadership 2018

All students in year 7 have had multiple opportunities this term to develop their leadership potential in preparation for 2018. Each student has written a letter to me expressing their suitability for roles offered across all areas of our school. I have appreciated the time that most have taken to consider what they would be best suited for. I have communicated to all students on a number of occasions that my view of leadership is one of "servant leadership" not "being in charge".

This has strong links to leadership in the bible and is a living expression of service to others. I have also communicated to students that some will be disappointed with the roles assigned. This is a natural response. However experience has shown me that these times are also learning opportunities for developing resilience and resetting to adjust to the role that exists. We are currently working through these roles as a staff with the final decision and communication resting with me. This information will be shared with our Year 7 students next Wednesday and at our Prizegiving Thursday 14th December.



Some roles have a greater public face and voice - Student Leaders and Church Leaders in particular. Head/s of Choir and Orchestra have limited yet public opportunities. House Captains, Enviro Leaders, Peer Support, Information Centre, Sports Leaders, Technology Leaders have important roles to play within the school environment. These factors, while they may differ from emphasis in previous years, acknowledge the actual expectations and duties within the roles.

Staff and I very much look forward to working with our current year 7 Students as year 8 Leaders. They will begin their roles from the start of 2018 outworking our special character and working to bring their ideas to fruition as the year unfolds. They will be fortunate to be the first Year 8 class since 2011 to have access to the full campus.

Year 8 2018 School Based Vaccination Programme

We are pleased to inform you the Canterbury DHB will continue to offer a School Based Vaccination Programme to Year 8 boys and girls, who have not completed their eleven year old vaccinations in General Practice.

The School Based Vaccination programme will offer the two dose HPV vaccinations to protect against genital warts, cervical cancer, throat and mouth cancers, and other types of cancers later in life. In 2018 the programme has been extended to include a one dose Boostrix vaccination to provide protection against Tetanus, Diphtheria and Whooping Cough.

To enable students to receive the vaccinations at school, a vaccination pack will be sent home in Term one, Parent/Caregivers will need to complete and return the consent form to school.
