Mana Ake

Mana Ake - Stronger for Tomorrow was established in March 2018 to promote wellbeing and positive mental health for children in school years 1-8 across Canterbury. It was the result of additional funding provided by the government in response to the ongoing effects on children of the Canterbury Earthquakes.

The initiative aims to provide early intervention and support for teachers, families and whānau when children are experiencing ongoing issues that impact their wellbeing. The service can support individual children and groups of children and provide advice, guidance and support for teachers and parents/whānau.

This term our school, along with the other primary schools in our Community of Learning (St Martins, Waltham, Beckenham, Opawa, Diamond Harbour) will be working together to develop systems for accessing this resource. We will have a team of five dedicated 'kaimahi' - workers, who come from a range of NGO backgrounds involved in supporting mental health and wellbeing of children and families.

We are looking forward to being able to have these people able to engage with our children and families. If we think your child might benefit from some support through this resource, we will always discuss this with you first, and you will be able to decide if you feel this is appropriate for your child and family.

End of the School Day

After some questions from parents and whānau, I thought I would add some details in this newsletter.

St Mark's School has always finished at 3.00pm in recent history and has encouraged community time after this time for children's play and parent catch up. The "clearing bell" has rung at various times but is currently set at 3.15pm now to signal the end of this community time. This ensures that professional meetings - staff meetings, team meetings, parent/teacher meetings, senior staff meetings and professional learning and development can begin as soon after 3.15pm as is practicable. This allows for those staff on gate duty, the late departure of Power Zone/Casper programs and circumstances for individual parents to be met in terms of duty of care and responsibility for staff. We acknowledge the need to be flexible at the end of the day, but do thank you for your support in this, as staff communicating well across teams in meetings, and professional development time is a significant part of success for students.

November 5th

On Monday night many of you will have had the "backyard fun" of fireworks in your homes or those of friends. I have some memories too - some better experiences than others! But November 5th in New Zealand is also a date to remember for the events at Parihaka. On this day in 1881, several thousand Maori sat quietly on the marae as children sang, while 1600 colonial troops arrived to claim the land as their own. The leaders Te Whiti o Rongomai and Tohu Kākahi had ordered a pacifist response to troops who ultimately imprisoned the leaders without trial, destroyed gardens, burned houses and forcibly sent iwi to other areas of New Zealand. An apology was offered by the Crown in June 2017, but since 2006 Parihaka nestled in the hill surrounding Mt Taranaki has become a place signifying peace. This image is mirrored in the Sermon on the Mount and the message to turn the other cheek and love our enemies seeking to turn them into friends (Matt:5 38 - 40). A radical idea!

Parihaka is an historical story worth knowing well.
