Race Distances / order: Year 4 (10.30) 1 lap

Year 3 (10.45) 1 shorter lap

Year 5 (11)& 6 (11.20) 2 laps - 2km

Year 7 (11.40) & 8(12) 3 laps - 3km

Transportation: Students will walk to and from Hansen Park.

Student Requirements:

- Come to school dressed in full PE gear (shorts, top, white sports socks, shoes)
- If a school tracksuit or sweatshirt is owned it should be worn, alternatively jerseys, thermals and blazers may be worn
- Students should be dressed in warm clothing as Hansen Park can be very cold and we will be there for 2 hours

Parents' Association Newsletter


