Here are some top tips to think about for your Walk with a Purpose -

- Children walking to school are able to walk in mufti and remain in mufti for the school day. Make sure
 they dress up warm with jacket, hat, gloves and possibly thermal underwear in preparation for a cold
 morning.
- Plan your walk so that you arrive to school by 8.30am.
- Children must be accompanied by an adult walking to school.
- If you live a long way from school you may consider driving some of the way then walking the rest.
- Make sure you pack extra food in children's lunch boxes as they might be extra hungry! Also children may need snacks and water to drink on their walk to school.
- Parents/caregivers need to make a plan with how they get home after their walk to school. Consider carpooling.
- If children don't want to carry a heavy bag, arrange for school bags to be dropped at school by a helpful adult.
- The wonderful parents association will be providing hot chocolates and a muffin for children arriving to school after their walk.
- It would be wonderful if you could join the 9 am school assembly to hear the Founder and Executive Director of Fountain of Peace, Jane Laurie speaking.
- Smile, knowing your fundraising efforts are making a difference in the lives of others.
