Teacher Only Days

As you may be aware the Ministry of Education, as part of negotiations with NZEI members in 2019, offered an additional 8 days over 3 years (the period of current contracts). St Mark's School staff have decided in 2020 that Teacher Only days will be:

ICAS Exams

For many years St Mark's School has offered ICAS competitions as an extension opportunity. Whilst they have been popular, schools and teachers have always been aware that coming from the University of New South Wales, they are based on the Australian Curriculum so learning from our classrooms is not aligned to them.

That being said, the sitting of an external exam under exam conditions can be beneficial over time.

In 2019 there were major changes to how ICAS exams were designed, structured, priced and administered. This prompted myself and senior management to look at alternatives. The question was always for us "If not ICAS then what?"

The Centre for Evaluation and Monitoring (CEM) at the University of Canterbury have developed external assessments in English, Science, Mathematics and Spelling. These assessments are skills based, based on the New Zealand Curriculum (NZC) and have been written by NZ teachers. Like ICAS the same grades are given, with Distinction awards reserved for the top 1% of students. All exams are 50 minutes long and take place in Term 2 - the cost is currently \$9.00.

Last year Miss Yonetani trialled the Spelling Exam to ensure we had a window on their quality. She was impressed and those that participated achieved results closely matched to her overall teacher judgements.

It is our view that the CEM competitions, because of their alignment to NZC, their use by over 350 schools nationwide (including St Margaret's College in Christchurch, and Wakatipu High who use them to assess eligibility for extension and Gifted and Talented programs) offer the best alternative for St Mark's School going forward.
