Following on from the extensive email yesterday there is still more news!!!

You will have read in my email yesterday that all students are able to return to school. The Public Health advice is that schools are in the "exceptional" bracket as far as "gatherings" go.

As a school we have decided to learn together, play together and eat together in waka under Alert Level 2. Waka Hourua, Waka Puhara and Mōkihi will have separate eating, playing and church times. This means we don't have 100 in any one place at one time and this is part of our great transition plan moving from home to school. Each waka will have unfettered access to the playgrounds, turf and their own sports equipment.

Friends and social connections will be the priority - we are SO looking forward to our school family being onsite.

For clarity here is the information from lona Holsted sent in the Education Bulletin yesterday: Are we able to have more than 100 students in our Modern Learning Environment/classrooms?

Yes you are. Workplaces, educational facilities, and public and school transport are not considered mass gatherings. This means there are no restrictions on numbers of people indoors or outside at schools and early learning services, other than what other public health or health and safety measures require.
