Term Dates 2021

After careful attention to the requirements of the Ministry of Education I want to confirm the following Term dates for 2021.

I draw your attention to the first Monday of **every** term - These will be **4 TEACHER ONLY DAYS in 2021 (TOD).** As part of the Primary Teachers and Principals collective agreement 8 additional teacher only days were to be added to the calendar (at no cost to the number of half days), and to be used before **June 2022**.




Chess




