return.

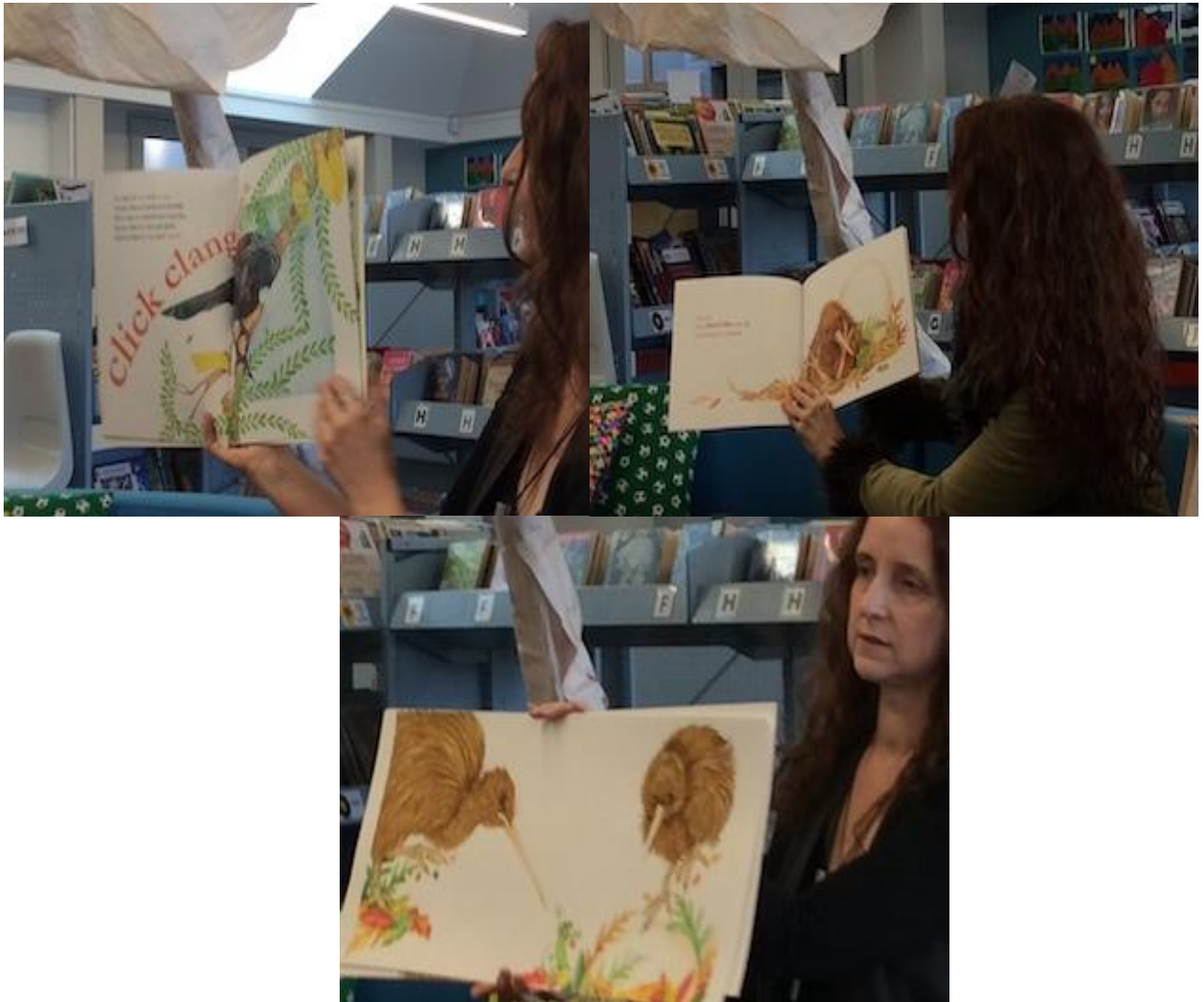
Elevation: 386m



This route was first constructed in 1850 for Canterbury's first European settlers travelling between Lyttelton and Christchurch. A steep track but stunning views over the city to the Southern Alps and of Lyttelton and Banks Peninsula make it worthwhile! There are a number of memorial seats on the way up and a stone shelter at the top to commemorate the pioneer women of Canterbury.
