Specialist Teachers

The media has been awash with articles relating to education standards in Aotearoa, in particular Mathematics, Reading and Science. Criticism from both the Ministry of Education, Principals, Teachers and Researchers abound on various issues, however most agree that the planning and sequencing of learning and the differentiation of learning to need, are directly linked to the impact of high quality teaching and learning.

Our decision to pilot a specialist teaching model in 2021 was made ahead of these headlines. The decision was based on whānau survey data combined with staff reflective practice that sought options to balance a vibrant local curriculum. Our model seeks evidence of links to wide curriculum coverage across the New Zealand curriculum, a balance of content and competencies, while ensuring the outworking of the Board of Trustees strategic goal of developing future thinkers and learners within the frame of our special character. Even though our achievement data indicates overall our students are achieving highly relative to age expectations, we must always be striving for best practice for all. The Gifted Education hui facilitated by **Miss** <u>Cristy</u> <u>Yonetani on Tuesday, is an example of the</u> <u>ongoing conversation we must have as a school</u> <u>community as we direct resources to curricula</u> <u>and programs with strong evidence of efficacy.</u>

Board of Trustees Communication February 2021

It doesn't seem that long ago that we were sat together as a school community in the hall, celebrating student achievements and farewelling a number of students. Here we are now in week 3 of a new school year, with new students and the excitement that comes with different classrooms, teachers and opportunities.

Already there have been camps, assemblies, church services and back to school barbeques – the year is truly already in full swing!

On Sunday night as we entered Level 2, I was reminded of the incredible leadership and planning we have here at St Mark's. You would all have received communications outlining what to expect at this level, and once again staff have worked quickly and with kindness to ensure that our community is safe and flourishing.

As a Board, in 2021 we have reflected on a number of areas where our budget is impacted and for the first time we want to share that with you as a school community, and some of the changes that will be implemented to assist.

As you know, your attendance dues go to the Board of Proprietors, and contribute to the beautiful facilities your children learn in each day. As a Board of Trustees, we receive an operating grant from the Ministry of Education which enables staffing but not many 'extras' – that's why we need our amazing Parents' Association to assist us with fundraising for these.

We have identified as a Board of Trustees two key areas, where if we partner with parents we will be able to redirect some of these funds to enhance teaching and learning outcomes for students.



Lost Library Books

 Last year over 100 library books were not returned by families. As a school we have a small budget for new library books each year, and the cost to replace these 100 books is far outside of this. What this means, is that we are not able to expand our options, as we have only been able to fund part of what was missing. Obviously this is not sustainable, so effective from 2021 any lost books will incur a \$20 fee which will appear on your invoice. This will mean that the school library will continue to grow each year as any lost books (which we hope will be fewer) will be replaced as well as our small budget able to purchase new and different titles.



Transport Fee

 As many of you will be aware, the Parents' Association generously donated the vans to the school over a year ago. These are a wonderful asset to our school and already have received significant use. They also come with expenses of petrol and insurance, which is not something the BOT receive funding for. This incurs a cost of around \$6,000 per year, so to assist with this cost there will be a transport cost added to trips to assist with a contribution towards this. As you can imagine if we can get some assistance to cover this cost it enables other opportunities for the Board to invest in – whether that be additional teaching hours, professional development for staff – all of which benefit teaching and learning outcomes for students.

We hope that this communication will explain the need and rationale for these changes, however should you have any questions please don't hesitate to contact us. As always, should there be any welfare matters for your whanau related to these changes, please discuss these with the office/principal.

The Board of Trustees are excited at the opportunities that lie ahead in 2021, and as always are committed to working to ensure that every child has the opportunities they need to reach their full potential.

Cathedral Serving Team

(The Cathedral Servers)

The Transitional Cathedral is blessed by the dedication of our Serving Team (The Cathedral Servers), who form an important and integral part of our public worship. This dynamic and diverse group of young people help to prepare the cathedral for services each Sunday, and on important festivals; they then take on particular roles within the service to ensure that everything runs smoothly.

It is a great place for the group to socialise, meet and make friends and have fun, all while serving God. Outside of the normal round of services, the team also gets together for training events and celebrations. We aim to develop skills in adaptability, teamwork and leadership.

Servers can be aged between year 4 to University, and are part of a rostered weekly team, with a team leader and a number of other servers. Most servers commit to one Sunday per month, although they are welcome to serve more often if they wish.

To be a Cathedral Server means to take up the responsibility of answering the call of the church – the body of believers in Jesus, to fulfill a special function in offering worship and service to God. You play a role in helping others draw closer to God through their worship at the Cathedral, and you meet others and share this ministry within a team environment.
