### **Bullying and St Mark's School**

Bullying or abuse of any kind has no place in our school. This is true for students and all members of our community.

Staff have developed an anti bullying program for our school - Aoraki Matatu - based on best practice and wrapped in our special character which is enveloped in how we treat each other every day, how our friendships with others have love at the centre and forgiveness is a significant part of our restorative practices.

Understanding words like targets, initiators, bystanders and upstanders, help children to learn how their behaviour can, along with the help of adults (teachers at school) become acts of love and kindness in the face of bullying behaviour. This is not telling tales, but rather a realisation that at times a trusted adult is needed to resolve a situation.

Next week is our **Book Week** and we have decided to use this opportunity to integrate our anti bullying processes with it. There are an ample number of books in Ōmoho which focus on friendships, how to include others in our games in the playground and classroom, and that loving others is a priority.

Next week we will also observe the message of "Kōrero Mai, Kōrero Atu, Mauri Tū, Mauri Ora -Speak Up, Stand Together, Stop Bullying" Friday 28th May will be "Wear Something Pink or Favourite Colour" Mufti Day.




