We are called to love and uphold mana, and I have a firm view that in our school issues can be resolved through conversation, grace and restoration in love.

# ST MARK'S SCHOOL FOUNTAIN OF PEACE NZ – WALK WITH A PURPOSE

#### Information Sheet

We would like to extend a warm invitation to the St Mark's School community to join our Fountain of Peace NZ – Walk with a Purpose fundraising event on Friday the 17th of June, to help raise funds for Fountain of Peace Children's Foundation NZ. Fountain of Peace NZ is working in Western Uganda, creating family-based homes within a village community, for orphaned and abandoned children, as well as working to provide clean water, education, health care and sustainable projects for the whole community.

At present funds are being raised towards the construction of a new family-based home, for eight orphaned and abandoned children who have been rescued into the care of Fountain of Peace. This home is to be named Canterbury House. The funds raised by our St Mark's School community will be going towards the furnishings of this family home. This includes furnishing the bedrooms, kitchen, bathrooms, living and dining area.

For students and family members wanting to take part in this uplifting event they can either walk from their home taking their own route, or join one of the four different walking routes coming from Westmorland, Mt Pleasant, Lyttleton, or the Christchurch Transitional Cathedral. Walking route maps will be sent via the St Mark's School App once they have been finalised. Students should aim to arrive at school around 8.30am. The wonderful St Mark's School Parents Association will be providing a hot drink and snack for walkers when they arrive at school. The significance of walking to school is that many children in Uganda have to walk up to 10 km to and from school each day, often on an empty tummy. It helps our students in further developing their sense of empathy and thoughtfulness towards those less fortunate.

Students taking part in this Fountain of Peace NZ – Walk with a Purpose can wear mufti for the walk and for the entire school day. Please pack extra snacks for your child and ensure they have a water bottle and any personal medication which may be required for the walk (i.e. asthma inhaler). Students can either carry their school bag or you could drop it to school at around 8.30am when they arrive.

If your child would like to join this fundraising walk, please complete the sign-up/waiver form before Friday 10th June. This will also be sent on the School App and will include an event waiver for parents/caregivers who would like to participate. We will require one adult for every five students participating in this event, who will be designated to be responsible for these children from the start to the finish of the walk. We will be setting up whatsapp groups for communication leading up to the event and for communication on the day.
