Teacher-Only Day/Staff Curriculum Implementation Day

Due to my sabbatical, I have inadvertently missed the communication about a second Teacher Only Day Scheduled for all kura/schools across the country. These days are to be specifically dedicated to the understanding and implementation of the Refreshed NZ Curriculum, I apologise for this oversight, and offer the following link for your information and the italicised communication in it indicating dates.

Teacher-only days (TOD) - NCEA Education

Following consultation with the Sector Advisory Group supporting teacher-only days, the period within which the second teacher-only day in 2023 will take place has been set for Term 4: Monday 13 November – Friday 24 November 2023.

St Mark's School will have this second Teacher Only Day on Monday 20th November - school will be closed for students on this day. This is now in the calendar.

- Monday 20th November Teacher Only Day Curriculum Implementation Professional Learning Day
