Kia ora St Mark's whānau,

Term 3 has arrived!!! How did that happen so quickly? It is the term of the Senior Production Moana, and guaranteed warming of our days!

#### <u>Matariki</u>

When the Matariki cluster of stars reappear in our night sky, this is the signal of Māori New Year. This cluster of stars is recognised in other parts of the world. In English the use of the Greek work Pleiades is used, or the Seven Sisters, in Hawaiian culture the stars are known as Makali'i and in Japan Subaru "gathered together". The presence of Matariki in the early morning sky signals what is at the heart of the celebrations - Mātauranga Māori (wisdom and knowledge) and that means it is a time for remembering, giving thanks for the present and looking to the future together. Crucial plantings, sharing kai and karakia are evident. In addition the presence of stars for wayfinding and navigating the vast waters of the Pacific, ensures we can be thankful to God for creation, and how the joining of our families and homes sustain our faith and hope. What a wonderful evening of community last night amidst our annual Matariki celebrations. Mrs Emily Wells, with support from staff and community members, planned and facilitated an evening of prayer, stories and fellowship. Grateful thanks to Gabby Aberhart for all her work. The stones from Birdlings Flat were included because of the story of Matariki written by Television presenter Miriama Kamo from her childhood memories. It is clear that after the forced separation and isolation of Covid-19, our school community craves opportunities to come together in friendship and fellowship.

#### Siblings 2024 - urgent reminder!
