BYMC 2024 @cyclone



Kia ora koutou,

As you are hopefully aware, the transition of Year 5 students to Waka Hourua (the senior school) brings with it the requirement to have their own Chromebook to bring to school each day.

We work with Cyclone, our IT support company to offer devices that are suitable for the learning your tamariki will be undertaking on devices from next year. They provide us with a portal through which you can view and purchase these devices. Just select St Mark's Opawa from the dropdown list.

To help you make a decision about choosing a chromebook we are hosting an information session with Cyclone, here at school, at 3.15pm on Wednesday, the 22nd of November. We will meet in our Ōmoho (library) where you will be able to ask any questions you may have. The Cyclone team will have demonstration devices with them so that you can have a look at what is available.

When purchasing, please know that a case is a must-have item, as students take their Chromebooks home every day to charge. Headphones are optional but recommended, especially for students who benefit from voice-typing with a mic on their headphones.

As the gallery do contain a number of photos, it is advised that you do give these a few minutes to load, and use a strong WIFI connection.

Please read the gallery notes, as that provides an outline of the new order site.

Photos can be viewed in batches by class. We hope this will assist the viewing process, by reducing the range individual photos seen, by making it easier to locate your child(ren). Sibling photos remain visible in a separate gallery. Class photos, that have now all been named and checked, appear in class category.

Delivery is available back to school when orders have been received BY midnight, 26 November 2023.

Given recent cost rises, a \$1.15 handling charge will be added to all non-post orders.

This is a fairly new system and Photoshots are proud to offer a range of new options. There is no longer an order envelope, and all ordering is online, including payment. You can start viewing and ordering as soon as you receive this message. With this change, we have been able to decrease standard print pricing slightly. Parents may note we have a greater range of products on offer, now including high quality canvas and framing options. We now also offer Afterpay. We have also introduced the option to purchase digital files (sibling and individuals only).

For orders over \$120, I now have a discount code available, to receive 10% off your purchase. Feel free to use the code: 10DISC
