Welcome to St Mark's School for 2018. Staff hope that you have all enjoyed a lovely break and shared family time. We are now ready to embark on our first year with the whole campus open and look forward to maximising the strength of our physical environment. Gone are the restrictions on space and teaching spaces. We look forward to working with you to fully outwork our curriculum surrounded by our special character.

Powhiri

It was wonderful to welcome so many of you to our powhiri on Monday where we welcomed **Mrs Liz Coster** (Assistant Principal), **Ms May Bryant, Mrs Maree Bigelow and Rev. Canon Ben Truman.** Through karanga, waiata, mihi, haka and gift giving we were able to honour them and their shift from manuhiri (guest) to whanau (our St Mark's family), and they were supported by their own families.

A highlight was the gorgeous karanga written and delivered especially for our school by **Mrs Clare Pattison**. In this karanga is a call to this school highlighting our christian walk and our four school values - Grace, Excellence, Courage and Faithfulness.

Staff

To start the year staff enjoyed two days together, gathering a shared vision for 2018, committing to systems and processes that track the progress and development of every student and building relationships with new staff. A priority for 2018 will be the review of our curriculum including those "subjects" that would fall under the term "broad curriculum" - Science, PE, Art, Environmental Education, Drama, Dance to name a few. Literacy (Reading, Writing, Spelling) and Mathematics are key areas, however research is clear that raising achievement in these areas is also indicated by robust teaching and learning in the others. Tracking every child across all areas and whatever their gifts and talents and learning needs. We will report on the progress of this review and gain your feedback at certain junctures.

As the class compositions are different this year, it will be important to hear and understand the benefits and challenges of these changes as we further refine our practice in this school. I am not prone to following others, but rather seek answers through good practice, good analysis and research evidence.

We will continue to work with a focus on Writing - our greatest need most recently (this is true for many schools in New Zealand) - and congratulate **Ms Katrina Steans** who won a position within our school supporting the achievement challenges of our Community of Learning - Te Mana Raupo. She will work specifically in our school to raise achievement in this area, monitoring the development of writing skills and working alongside colleagues from other schools to share best practice.

Noticeboards

This year we have three noticeboards. The one in the foyer is primarily our school noticeboard where you will find Board of Trustee news, Board of Proprietor news, Parents' Association news and other items related to our school. The noticeboard just inside the hallway leading to the hall will be for all our community notices. Further along the hall is a noticeboard that will be dedicated to our Environmental Education Program (more about that in a later newsletter) and a place for our Enviro Group Leaders to share their happenings with the school.



Church Services

In 2018 our weeks will be bookended by 2 church services - Monday, student lead service and Friday our formal full school service.

As you will see in the calendar there are school Eucharist services planned and school learning team services at St Anne's church. Rev. Ben Truman has made these changes so that he may join each Base Group class on a rotational basis for devotions on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Each learning team will deliver Religious Education on Fridays using age appropriate resources sourced by Rev. Ben. He will deliver the senior program in collaboration with staff. We are confident these programs will enhance our special character building faith in young children.

Ōmoho

This is now open for browsing and reading. We are not in a position to issue books yet due to a delay in hardware arriving for the purpose. I do want to thank **Mrs Christine Fairchild and Mrs Diane Stewart** who have audited and catalogued our collections ready for use.

Some furniture funded by our wonderful **Parents' Association** has arrived and we have bright new cushions courtesy of the clever hands of **Mrs Rachael Okey.** Please feel free to use this outstanding space with your children and we will let you know when issuing arrives!! We do ask that all books read are returned to exactly the same spot from whence they came. There has been much work done to catalogue our collections using a pictorial system, and picture books are alphabetically arranged.
