

I had a lot of ideas, but there was nothing that I loved until I went on the year 6 & 7 camp. At camp, there was this game. It was so basic, yet so fun. My friends and I loved it. I slept on it and the next day, I decided I would build it.

I went and had a look at it and had a look what it was made out of. When we got back to school, I told Ms Yonetani about it. She said I need a budget and a plan. The next day I was up early, getting ready to be picked up. I worked the whole day sweeping and helping. The next day, they said I could have their worker Deon for a whole hour. I gave him the measurements and he got to work. 10 minutes later it was done. He asked me if I had ever welded and I said, 'No.' Then I did my first ever weld.

That night I was measuring rope for the two golf balls to go on. I had 6 of them to make. Then I went to my Aunty's and tested it out with my cousins. It was awesome.


Student Success
