An Update from the Board of Trustees Review Committee

Term 4 Outcomes:

As you will recall in term 4 we advised you that two policies were up for review as part of the regular 3 yearly cycle. We also provided you with the login details for school docs if you wanted to provide some feedback as part of this process.

Here is a summary of the outcomes

• Health and Safety

- There were no responses provided for this review. As it was an optional review and not scheduled the Board will review this again at a later date when scheduled.

• Education Outside the Classroom

- 1 piece of feedback.
- No changes required.
- 4/5 rating for both policy and implementation rating.

Sun protection policy

- Policy content 4.67/5 rating
- No changes required.
- Implementation rating 3/5
- What this means is that the policy doesn't need changing but there's some feedback to suggest it might require the staff having a look operationally to ensure its being applied appropriately and consistently.
