Last week, Kōura and Pūtakitaki walked down to see the culturally important mahinga kai (food gathering site) just at the start of Richardson Tce.

To help give the children an appreciation of the length of Ōpāwaho, the Heathcote River, we embarked on a bus trip from the source to the sea.

We started in the Sparks Rd wetland - a flood protection initiative. Seeing all the wetland and native plants gave them an idea of what the land of Christchurch was like before it was built upon.

At Nga Puna Wai, we located one of the springs that begin the river. Our bus driver then wound us around Ashgrove Tce, Waimea Tce, stopping to see more springs at Beckenham Park.

Driving along Garlands Rd gave us a glimpse into the factories that are built close to the river.

Finally, we ended up at Settlers Crescent, looking at the ferry crossing site used by immigrants from the first 4 ships.

Tournament of Minds requires teams to work together for six weeks without assistance from teachers, parents, or peers. Students are responsible for developing and presenting their solution to a creative challenge, which they must perform within 10-minutes in a 3x3m performance space. For our Language Literature challenge, we also had to create a 30-second promotional video and integrate it into our performance. Students worked together to write the script and create all of the props and costumes. The other part of Tournament of Minds is a spontaneous challenge, which is only revealed on the day. For the spontaneous challenge, students have to think quickly and collaborate to generate a creative solution to a problem in only a few minutes.


