Seesaw


Last year we trialled **Seesaw** - a program of "in time" sharing where students can send their learning directly to parents during the school day. This enables parents to be engaged at the time and comment on what their child has achieved. The free app allowed parents to receive this information on their mobile device.

In 2019 as a trial, we will shift the newsletter and other class and team communication to Seesaw ensuring school information is not buried in your inbox! We will make this shift in Term 2 giving everyone time to download the app, talk to their class teacher and team leader, and practice using it's features. The newsletter and other communications will be available in print or digital form initially.



Mathematics!

This year our curriculum focus is mathematics. We have funded professional development for staff from the University of Canterbury - Ms Carol Butel and ongoing specialist professional development from Mr Brent Langford from Evaluation Associates. As we inquire into our practice in this area of the curriculum we will share our learnings (not dissimilar to the All Blacks!) and seek your views throughout the year. Some class levels have specific stationery items that lend well to this inquiry but overall our commitment is to a coherent and local curriculum is the common goal.

Explorers are very courageous




Billets required for the evening of Tuesday 21st May 2019
