We will make this shift in **Term 2** giving everyone time to download the app, talk to their class teacher and team leader, and practice using its features. The newsletter and other communications will be available in print or digital form initially.

## Mathematics

As a collective staff constantly ask themselves: What is best practice? What shifts in pedagogy inform this practice? Is there research that informs this practice? One of the major shifts that has been going on across the world - the work of **internationally renowned Jo Boaler** may be of interest to you - is understanding how teaching and learning can support the development of "mathematical communities and mathematical thinkers". Yes this includes content and knowledge but also the processes around how children learn to manipulate mathematical concepts in the real world.

As we work through our professional learning in this area we will share our learning and involve you in the development of our local curriculum. Key pieces of research indicate that extended whanau are vital in this process. Communities of mathematical thinkers pay attention to the needs of everyone in a developmental context.

If Mathematics wasn't for you at school do not fear! "Maths Cafés" - where the mix of coffee/tea and number will be great places for understanding our partnerships going forward! If you cannot get to them we will post on **Seesaw!**

## Year 8 2019 School Based Vaccination Programme

We are pleased to inform you the Canterbury DHB will continue to offer a School Based Vaccination Programme to Year 8 boys and girls, who have not completed their eleven year old vaccinations in General Practice.

The School Based Vaccination programme will offer the two dose HPV vaccinations to protect against genital warts, cervical cancer, throat and mouth cancers, and other types of cancers later in life. In 2018 the programme has been extended to include a one dose Boostrix vaccination to provide protection against Tetanus, Diphtheria and Whooping Cough.

To enable students to receive the vaccinations at school, a vaccination pack will be sent home in Term 1. Parent/Caregiver will need to complete and return the consent form to school.

## Billets required for the evening of Tuesday 21st May 2019

The Anglican Schools' Conference is being held in Timaru this year. Delegates travelling internationally to the conference will need to arrive in Christchurch on Tuesday 21st May. The Polynesian delegates will include school chaplains, school principals and some Year 12 students. It is preferably that 2 students be billeted together. If you are able to provide dinner, bed and breakfast for people travelling from Fiji and Tonga to the Anglican Schools' Conference please let the School Office know.
